2011 Endless Mountains Digital Film Fest Winner Announced

The winner of the 2011 Endless Mountains Digital Film Festival was announced Friday, December 2, at the Keystone Theatre in Towanda. “Real Boy” took top place in an awards ceremony that followed the screening of the films submitted to the Bradford County Regional Arts Council’s fifth festival.

Filmmaker Warren Sheetz is a senior at the Rochester Institute of Technology in the Film and Animation program. Sheetz is originally from Troy, PA.

Other films submitted to the competition included: “Alone” by Alexander Troutner (Director, Actor & Narrator); “Battle of the Bulge” by Andy Moliski (Director/Special Effects) and Micaiah Douglas (Lead Actor); and “Drifter” by Andy Moliski (Director), Chris Harmon (Writer), James Misner (Music), and Josh Chacona & Micaiah Douglas (Lead Actors).

Bradford County Regional Arts Council’s Endless Mountains Digital Film Festival is open to filmmakers of all ages.
